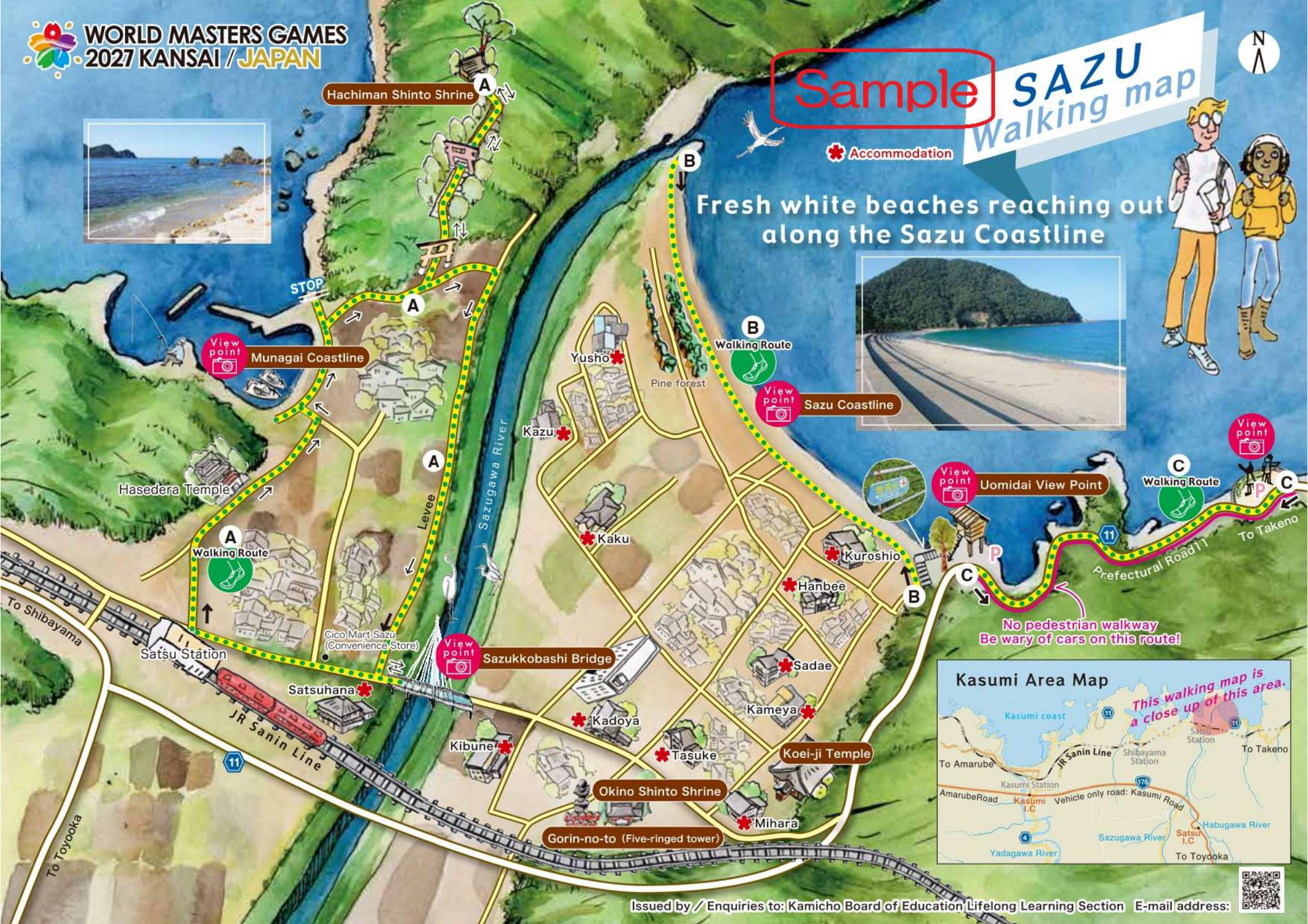
★ Accommodation

Walking Route



Satsu Station – Sazukobashi Bridge

⌚ Approx. 60 minutes walk

Starting from Satsu Station, taking a narrow road and walking alongside a waterway for a while before reaching Hasedera Temple

→ Small harbour with boats etc. lined up, and the Munagai Coastline

→ Take the 200 stone steps up the slope where a white torii gate can be seen, to reach Hachiman Shinto Shrine

→ Walk on the levee alongside the river to Sazukobashi Bridge. The structural view from the top of the bridge is beautiful.

Sazu Coastline

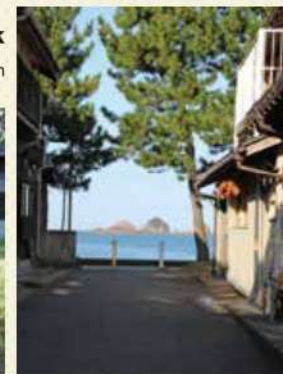
⌚ Approx. 30 minutes walk

Sazu Coastline is known for its fine white sandy beaches.

→ Walking here is easy with the pavements, but also walk to the water's edge.

→ Walk to the point where Sazugawa River meets the sea.

→ Enjoy the light filtering through the trees on your return journey towards town.

Uomidai View Point – Along the prefectural road

⌚ Approx. 10 minutes walk each way

In the most eastern point from the village, there is a stone stairway leading up to Uomidai View Point

→ Take in a panoramic view of the town of Sazu from Uomidai

→ Take in views of the vast sea from along the prefectural road route, while also seeing the waves crashing into the cliffs directly below.

→ Take a break on one of the benches in the parking area, before making starting back on your return journey.
