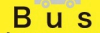

A Walking Route

The Way to Misaki

It is 3.5km from the Sora-no-eki to the village by bus, and about 1.7km from there to the lighthouse (accessible on foot only). Recommended access is to take the bus where available, and walk the rest.

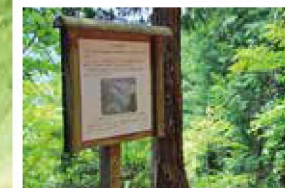
One way: Approx. 60 minutes walk

down on a miniature garden.



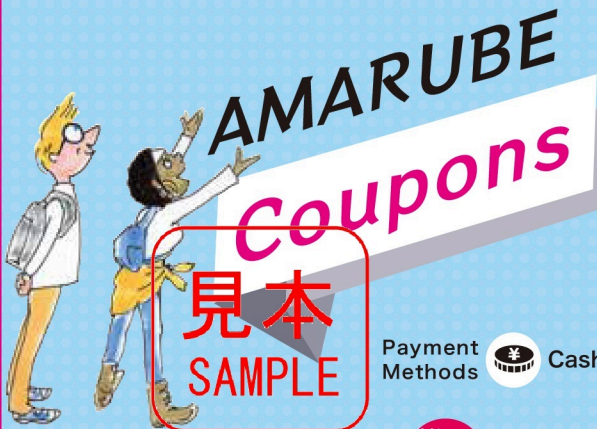
Takanosu-no-mori Forest: New green leaves in May make it the most beautiful time of the year here. Visitors can also enjoy views of the sea from between the trees.

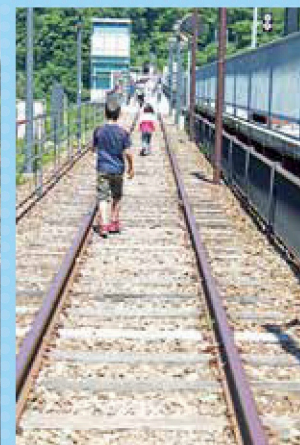

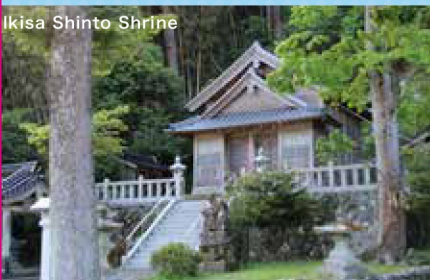

The red-brick colored 'Amarube Railroad Bridge' was once important for train operation in Amarube. Today, three pillars of the bridge have been preserved and are experiencing a new life as the 'Sora-no-eki' observatory. Literally meaning the station in the sky, here visitors can walk on old rails and sleepers, and see the train running from valley to valley with a spectacular view of the Sea of Japan up close. There is also an elevator made entirely with glass, so visitors can go up to the station in the sky, and enjoying the floating feeling at 41m high. It is located next to JR Amarube Station. 【Sora-no-eki 6:00 ~21:30, Free】

***Amarube Railroad Bridge:** An iron bridge with pillars made of steel (trestle type) with a height of 41.5 m and a length of 310.7 m at Amarube Station on the JR San-in Line. It was the largest iron bridge of this type in Japan at the time, and was the most well known aspect of this area for about 100 years from 1912 to 2010, when it was replaced with the current new bridge.

A WalkingRoute Road to Misaki



A straight road that starts from 'Ikisa Shinto Shrine' and continues along the mountainside. Overlooking the sea on one side, the road gradually slopes uphill, and the view of the sea also gradually widens. This paved road is easy to walk and is 3.5km to the village of Misaki. If using the bus, the stop will be in Misaki Village. Access to Misaki Lighthouse is only available on foot (approx. 1.7km from the village). Please note that buses are limited.

***About Misaki Lighthouse:** The light source at the lighthouse is 284m above sea level, making it the tallest white lighthouse in Japan. It delivers light over a long distance, and watches over the safety of ships daily. From here, visitors can get an unobstructed view of the ocean and distant peninsula.
